
Latino GI and Hepatology Health

 Population Health: Latinos account for ~ 20% of the US population and is increasing¹

Disease Burden:

- -Colorectal Cancer: ↓ screening, later stage diagnosis²
- -Chronic Liver Disease: ↑
 prevalence of MASLD/MASH
- + HCC: ↑ incidence, later stage diagnosis, ↑ mortality³



Health Equity in the Latino Community: Interventions

Improve Access & Screening

- Insurance coverage
- Community-based healthcare and screening programs
- Reduce cost of prescription medications





- Language concordant materials and care
- Community-based partners (i.e. promotoras, other CHW)



Research & Policy

- Inclusion in clinical trials
- Funding community-based interventions



Workforce & Representation


- Increasing Latino representation in healthcare workforce
- Training providers in culturally appropriate care








Health Equity in the Latino Community: Workforce
